



The Bridge that Peace Built

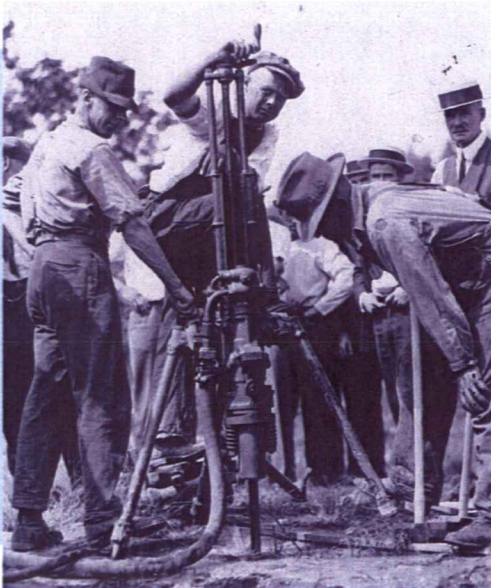
